Our journey begins today with our morning flight to Adelaide where on arrival into we are met by our local coach captain and make our way to Glenelg, Adelaide's most popular seaside suburb. For a gold coin donation we may like to visit The Bay Discovery Centre and Social History Museum which celebrates the cultural heritage of South Australia. The museum is a haven for history and art lovers and is housed in the iconic Town Hall not far from the Glenelg Jetty. Glenelg is a perfect location for our lunch stop with many restaurants, bars and cafés to choose from. After our free time at Glenelg. Later this afternoon we transfer into Adelaide for check in at the centrally located Ibis Adelaide where there will be time to freshen up before dinner.

Day 2. Sat 18 Sep: Adelaide "City of Churches"

This morning we visit St. Peters Cathedral to experience a guided tour of the church. Completed in 1904 after the foundation stone was laid in 1869, the Towers and Spires were built and consecrated in 1902 and have the heaviest and finest bells in the Southern Hemisphere. A major feature is the fascinating stain glass windows within the Cathedral, each with their own story. After leaving the Cathedral we travel through the "City of Churches" taking in the iconic buildings, parks and gardens that the city is renowned for. We then visit the Adelaide Oval where we will go behind closed doors and discover hidden secrets and relive celebrated moments. Witness the unique integration of the Oval's iconic heritage blended seamlessly with world-class facilities, access restricted areas, view the Bradman **Collection**, and experience the roar of the crowd as we take to the ground through the interactive players race. Step into living history as we explore inside the iconic scoreboard and see where some of the world's greatest musicians have entertained sold-out crowds. After enjoying lunch we enjoy the rest of the day at leisure before meeting for dinner. **Overnight Adelaide: Ibis Adelaide**

Day 3. Sun 19 Sep: Hahndorf - Goolwa - Victor Harbor

After check out this morning we head up into the Adelaide Hills to the Cedars, home and grounds of famed 20thcentury landscape painter **Hans Heysen**, where we enjoy a tour through the untouched family home and studio. Close by is Australia's oldest surviving German Village, Hahndorf. The village is proud of its German heritage still visible in its traditional streetscapes with small-goods, bakeries, cuckoo clocks, wooden folk art and German-style pubs. Our next stop is down at **One Paddock Currency Creek Winery** for **tastings and lunch** before arriving in the **historic** Murray River Port of Goolwa, home to the 'Mouth of the Murray' and the 'Cockle Train'.

Day 3 cont.....

After a stroll around the wharf precinct we board the 4.30pm **Cockle Train** which commences its run from the Goolwa station, in the historic Wharf Precinct. **Our rail journey** travels along the oldest steel railed railway in Australia dating back to 1854 when it was constructed to provide a link between the River Murray and the ocean wharfs at Pt Elliot and later at Victor Harbor. Climbing to the top of the coastal cliffs, experience some of the most **picturesque coastal scenery** on the Fleurieu Peninsula, with nothing separating us from the beach below and a perfect view of the Southern Ocean. Our 30 minute journey arrives in Victor Harbor before our transfer to the McCracken Country Club our home for the next two nights. After a rest and freshen up we gather for drinks at own cost before **dinner in the Bar and Grill Restaurant.**

Overnight Victor Harbor: McCracken Country Club Hotel

Day 4. Mon 20 Sep: Victor Harbor - Goolwa - Coorong National Park

Following breakfast our days starts at Victor Harbor's **Station Master's Residence National Trust Museum** which was built 1866 and consists of six display rooms filled with magnificent heritage furniture, china and linen, memorabilia from 19th century and historic photographs of Victor Harbor. After our **tour of the residence and museum** we enjoy a **tour of Victor Harbor and Port Elliott** before some free time which will allow those wishing to take the **10.45am Horse Drawn Tram across to Granite Island**. We then cross back to the where we check-in and board our **Coorong Wildlife Discovery Lunch Cruise** which takes us on a delightful journey into the mighty **Coorong National Park**. Our 3.5 hour cruise includes lunch and afternoon tea, two short guided walks, spectacular scenery, bird watching and the famous Murray River Mouth. On completion of our cruise we return to our accommodation to relax before dinner.

Overnight Victor Harbor: McCracken Country Club Hotel

Day 5. Tues 21 Sep: Cape Jervis - Kangaroo Island

This morning after breakfast and check out we depart Victor Harbor and travel across to **Cape Jervis** to board the **Kangaroo Island Sea Link Ferry** across to **Kangaroo Island**. At Penneshaw we are met by **our experienced guide** and begin our touring of the Island. At **Clifford's Honey Farm** we hear about the placid Ligurian Bees, their breeding and the production of over 10,000 kilograms of pure honey annually. Kangaroo Island is thought to be the only place in the world where a pure strain of the Ligurian bees exists. Enjoy a taste of different honey varieties and the opportunity to purchase some of Jenny's famous honey ice cream. Next we visit the **Raptor Domain** and experience an in-flight **Birds of Prey display** - optional if you would like the opportunity to put a glove on and have a bird fly to you! (Extra cost). We then stop by **Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Oil Distillery** for lunch and a guided tour. The distilling process here has operated the same way since the 1890's. We then make our stop at **Kangaroo Island Spirits**, Australia's first dedicated Gin Distillery, enjoy tastings out in the garden, including three mini cocktails before we arrive at our accommodation for check in and dinner.

Overnight Kingscote: Kangaroo Island Seaside Inn

Day 6. Wed 22 Sept: Seal Bay - Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park

Today, we begin early and travel down to the famous **Seal Bay Conservation Park**, the only place in the world where we can stroll with our guide through a wild seal colony. Seal Bay is home to around 600 of the rare Australian Sea Lions. After Seal Bay it's up to Parndana to the Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park. Kangaroo Island is well known for its thriving koala population however over 150,000 hectares has been lost due to recent events which has effected the koala population dramatically. We need to pull together to save this Australian icon. The Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park has started a fundraiser to raise funds for care, pain relief, medication and the infrastructure needed to house and treat the large number of koala and animals coming into their care. The wildlife park is home to over 150 native species and over 600 animals. Enjoy a guided tour of the park followed by lunch before making our way to Emu Bay Lavender Farm to learn about lavender production, see it in its various stages throughout the season and even taste some goodies made with lavender. Walk around the garden and visit the charming gift shop which sells lavender essential oils, scented candles and other Kangaroo Island lavender products. The story of the Kangaroo Island Brewery and Mike's journey unfolds next at his new brewery where most, if not all, materials used are recycled and have an amazing story. From local shearing sheds to local quarried stone, the brewery is as described by Mike, "local as hell"! To Mike it all made sense to build a brewery and fill a gap as the island was lucky enough to have fantastic wineries and even a micro distillery, but up until now, no brewery. We then travel back through Kingscote and out to Reeves Point, South Australia's first official European settlement from 1836 it is on the Australian Heritage List although after six months it was decided that the island's resources were insufficient to support the community. The Old Mulberry Tree which was planted in 1836 still bears fruit and the history of the Pioneer Historical Cemetery will also be covered. Late afternoon we return to our accommodation for a rest, before dinner in the hotel restaurant.

Day 7. Thurs 23 Sep: Kangaroo Island - Narracoorte

Our last day on Kangaroo Island, has us travelling back down to **Penneshaw** home to the original **Frenchman's Rock**. We board the **10.30am Kangaroo Island Sea Link Ferry** for our return journey to **Cape Jervis**. After disembarking we head up to the **Bridge Hotel Langhorne Creek for lunch** before travelling across to **Coonalpyn** to view the towns **Silo Art Murals featuring five Coonalpyn Primary School children representing Coonalpyn's 'hope for the future'**. From Coonalpyn its about a two hour drive down into Narracoorte to our motel for check in, rest and freshen up before dinner.

Overnight Narracoorte: William MacIntosh Motor Lodge

Day 8. Fri 24 Sep: Narracoorte - Mount Gambier - Warrnambool

Breakfast & Dinner

This morning after breakfast and checkout we continue down into Mount Gambier home to the iconic Blue Lake and Umpherston Sinkhole (or the Sunken Garden) which is one of the most spectacular gardens located in the Mount Gambier region. The beauty of the Umpherston Sinkhole has to be seen to be believed when observed from the viewing platforms at the top of the sinkhole and also down inside the sinkhole itself. The kiosk on site offers coffee, snacks, ice creams and souvenirs. No visit to Mount Gambier would be complete without taking a look at the **Blue Lake** which occupies one of the craters of the extinct volcano after which the city has been named. Early each November, the lake's sombre blue, which is in evidence during the winter months, mysteriously changes to an intense deep turquoise blue almost overnight. The colouring remains until late February, when it gradually changes. We experience a fascinating tour which takes us in a glass paneled lift down the original dolomite well shaft, from which water was originally extracted, through a tunnel to see the Blue Lake at close proximity while learning about the hydrology of Mount Gambier's water supply and the aquifer system. This afternoon we travel across to Warrnambool for a highlights tour with our local guide. From Flagstaff Hill we begin our tour which takes in Whalers Inn, Lady Bay, Logans beach, Middle Island, Thunder Point Coastal Reserve, Wollaston Bridge, Cannon Hill and Granny's Grave. Following check in and an early dinner we head to the Flagstaff Hill Museum which boasts Australia's richest collection of historical relics and artefacts from Shipwrecks of the Great Ocean Road. The most famous of these artefacts is Loch Ard Peacock standing 1.5 metres tall. We then check in to our accommodation and enjoy an early dinner before we head out again to witness the spectacular new multi-million dollar Sound and Laser Light Show "Shipwrecked" portraying the story of the journey and shipwreck of the Loch Ard. After the show we travel back to our motel for a good nights rest.

Overnight Warrnambool: Deep Blue Springs and Spa

Day 9. Sat 25 Sep: Warrnambool - Geelong

Today we explore the **Great Ocean Road** with its breathtaking scenery and beauty it has become one of the **Great Road Journeys of the World**, winding its way along one of Australia's most spectacular coastlines. The road was built to honour the servicemen and women of World War I, and extends more than 300km along the coast. We make our way down to Peterborough and the **Port Campbell National Park**. The start of our exciting scenic drive begins with the some photo shoots at the **Bay of Martyrs and Bay of Islands** before arriving at the **Loch Ard Gorge** (featured in last night's sound & light show), the site of a tragic shipwreck in 1878 when 50 or more people on board lost their lives as the iron hulled clipper Loch Ard came to grief against the rocks. It is also here we find the site of the **Twelve Apostles** – now eight huge pillars, which loom out of the surf, carved over time by the fury of the ocean, which in the last few years have toppled four back into the ocean. We then travel up into the **Great Otway National Park** through Lavers Hill and back down to **Apollo Bay** we can stretch our legs and buy lunch (own expense). Leaving Apollo Bay we continue along the coast through the small hamlets of Kennett and Wye River before arriving in the **delightful township of Lorne** for some time at leisure. The last leg of this great road journey takes us through Aireys Inlet and Anglesea before travelling up into Geelong for check in and dinner.

Overnight Geelong: Best Western Admiralty Motor Inn

Day 10. Sun 26 Sep: Geelong - Bellarine Peninsula - Brisbane

On our last day, we are joined by our local guide on a **sightseeing tour of the port of Geelong and the Bellarine Peninsula**. We then take a look through the **National Wool Museum** located on the Geelong Waterfront. We discover the past, present and future of the Australian Wool Industry. Around this area, we can see some of the old bluestone buildings classified by The National Trust, keeping residents and visitors always mindful of the city's heritage. Following this visit we enjoy **morning tea** at the **The Wool Exchange Cafe**, before departing Geelong and making our way to Melbourne Airport for our flight back to Brisbane after a wonderful tour with The Donald Simpson Centre & Trade Travel.

Restrictions are changing regularly and it is important we adhere to the Government health authority advice and we are confident all our suppliers are committed to these guidelines. Trade Travel will ensure that each tour is escorted by a tour host where required and will assist the group on a day to day basis. This may include: temperature checks daily of all passengers, monitoring physical distancing where possible - seat allocations and making sure cleanliness of coach is maintained throughout the tour with the use of Hand Sanitiser, Face Masks, regular hand washing etc.

COVIDSAFE APP

We recommend all our passengers download the COVIDSafe App before travelling on our tours. COVIDSafe is a new tool to help speed up how the health department can notify people who may have been exposed to COVID-19, so the health system can protect you, your family and friends.
